

Pluviometer

Pluviometer regulation. The pluviometer detects the millimeters of rain that have fallen by coloring its bright umbrella. Its function is to indicate the moment when the visitor is entitled to withdraw a voucher valid for n. 1 "rain check" free admission.

General conditions governing the operation of the pluviometer:

1. The pluviometer is the RGR 126 model which complies with the essential requirements and other relevant provisions established by Directive 1999/5 / EC;
2. The pluviometer is in operation every day from 09.00 to 14.00;
3. Based on the amount of rain falling in the indicated time slot, all the sectors that make up the pluviometer umbrella can be progressively illuminated;
4. When the last sector, equivalent to 5 mm/m² of rainfall, lights up, the visitor will be able to go to the Customer Service / Information Office of the Park to collect a voucher (rain check) that will allow him to return for free at the Park for the current season;
5. The voucher delivered entitles you to a free entrance to the Park to be used by the end of the current year;
6. On the day of return to the park, the visitor, going to a ticket office to request the new entrance ticket, must deliver the voucher received (rain check) and the stamped admission ticket for the rainy day verified by the pluviometer. In this way, a free ticket will be issued which will allow entry to the park;
7. The voucher (rain check) is not valid in the following cases: a. special events; b. In the event where the maximum capacity of the park is reached and, consequently, for safety reasons no further visitors are allowed; c. For owners of a season pass;
8. In the event of a power failure, the pluviometer will automatically reset to zero and the Park Management assumes no responsibility for these situations, as it cannot ascertain the amount of rain that has fallen.
